Ending Poverty Together

In 1996, Gilles Darmon, a new immigrant freshly arrived from France, witnessed the growing poverty phenomena in Israel and sought ways to make a positive change. Driven by an ideal of justice and the belief that Israeli society should be at the heart of this change, he established Latet ("To Give" in Hebrew), inspired by existing humanitarian models. What started as the ambitious dream of a young idealist is today the largest Israeli non-profit organization combating poverty, thanks to hundreds of thousands of individuals who have joined forces for the past 20 years.

Acting as an umbrella organization, Latet provides for the basic needs of populations living in poverty and food insecurity on an equal basis. The organization operates the leading national food bank and runs impactful aid programs with responsibility, effectiveness and innovation while relentlessly advocating for a better society.



BUILDING THE NEW ISRAELI SOCIETY

from serving populations in need...



The initiative consists of rescuing and distributing food nationwide. Being the largest Israeli food bank, we operate as an umbrella organization for 180 local NGOs across 105 communities. Over the years, we have developed a highly efficient modus operandi thanks to strategic partnerships with the food industry; **for every dollar invested, we provide 9 dollars worth of food**. Since 243,000 families live in severe food insecurity, we continue to lead the efforts to develop sustainable, innovative and replicable models of action.

Impact: ongoing aid to 60,000 families in need and \$30M worth of food distributed annually.



The only program in Israel that provides the most impoverished Holocaust survivors with a holistic aid package tailored to their needs; a monthly food box, emergency fund for paramedical needs, home restorations as well as social support in the form of individual volunteers and social events.

Impact: 1,000 Holocaust survivors receive holistic support on a monthly basis.



...to fostering the next generation.



The first youth organization of its kind dedicated to the nurturing of Israeli teens as caring citizens guided by values of volunteering and mutual responsibility. During the three-year program the youth implement social micro-initiatives within their own communities, developing their entrepreneurial and leadership skills. The youth organization operates nationwide and brings together participants from all backgrounds, including youth at risk.

Impact: each year, 2,500 youth become social leaders and carry out 150 social micro-initiatives to give back to their communities.
