Our Mission

Latet (To Give) - was established in order to reduce poverty, for a better and just society, by providing assistance to populations in need, mobilizing Israeli civil society towards mutual responsibility, and leading change in the national priorities.

HOW YOU CAN GET INVOLVED

Aid for Life



This program is the only one in Israel providing a comprehensive aid package (monthly food boxes, medical care, social support and home restorations) to 1,000 impoverished Holocaust survivors so that they may live out their last day with dignity.

What can you do? Provide for the needs of X Holocaust survivors for a period of Y time. In addition, you can write and collect blessing cards that will be attached to the food boxes distributed to survivors.

Connect: Create a connection the young generation with the history of its people, and serves as positive impact in the survivors' lives.

Nutritional Security



This program reduces food insecurity for 60,000 families (200,000 people) living in poverty across Israel by rescuing and distributing food nationwide.

What can you do? Provide monthly food boxes to families in need and connect with them through holiday greeting cards if the B'nai Mitzvah project is happening close to Jewish Holidays.

Educate: Raise awareness about poverty issues and inequality in Israel by educating your peers and providing direct help to poor families.

Latet Youth



This youth organization educates at-risk youth to volunteerism and transforms them into leaders by giving them the tools to lead their own social initiatives to improve their communities.

What can you do? Support a group of 15 Latet Youth participants in their journey of becoming social leaders by raising funds for their ongoing activity (weekly meetings, seminars, training materials, etc) and annual social initiatives

Connect: Create a meaningful connection with the youth in Israel, help them make a long term impact on Israeli society.
