LATET'S MISSION

Latet (To Give) was established in order to reduce poverty, for a better and just society, by providing assistance to needy populations, mobilizing Israeli civil society towards mutual responsibility, and leading change in the national priorities.

REPORT AMID THE COVID-19 CRISIS

We are proud to share with you Latet's Social Impact Report for 2020, which describes the scope of activity of our intervention programs, our various projects and actions amid the COVID-19 pandemic and economic crisis.

The global spread of Covid-19 has brought unprecedented challenges for governments, organizations, and humanity itself. The outbreak has created a health crisis, still present in our lives, that we expect vaccines to stop. Nonetheless, the main crisis caused by Corona is in the socioeconomic sphere. In Israel, 422,000 families have joined the cycle of financial hardship, 268,000 families have fallen into poverty, 143,000 families have been added to the population living in nutritional insecurity, while the middle class has shrunk by 15.5%. The families who were poor before the crisis and were already struggling to stay afloat are now coming out of it in an even more vulnerable state due to long periods at home, lack of ways of tending to the increasing necessities, and the tens of thousands of "working poor" losing their employment.

Thousands of middle-class families that have fallen into economic hardship, and have begun to slip into poverty, have had to seek help for the first time in their lives. In addition to physical deprivation, children and youth had to deal with growing digital and social disparities, while the elderly and Holocaust survivors found themselves exposed to high morbidity, social loneliness and isolation. Covid-19 has officially become Poverty-21.

In this chaotic reality, we at Latet have understood that this is the moment of truth. That now more than ever, Israeli society needs us. The extensive experience in emergency situations in Israel and around the world, the mapping ability, the understanding of the national and sectoral structure. The understanding of the urgency of the situation and our phenomenal human capital – both professional staff and volunteers – who dedicated themselves and worked day and night. The logistical infrastructure and its execution capability. The exceptional trust and support we have received from Israeli civil society, the strategic collaborations with the business sector and the creation of a broad coalition within the philanthropic world. All of these have helped us to double the scope of Latet's activities and provide the most extensive and effective humanitarian assistance on the ground since the organization's establishment.

Together with all our stakeholders – the general public, our volunteers, our staff, our local partner NGOs and our partners in the private and philanthropic sectors – we have managed to do the almost impossible this year.

Despite our cautious optimism in light of the vaccination campaign, we know that the economic impact of the pandemic will accompany us for a long time to come. Unfortunately, we estimate that the peak of the economic crisis is still ahead of us.

Therefore, this year too, we are getting ready to expand the scope of our assistance, fulfilling the organization's mission by acting as the first line of defence and a safety net for those families and elderly people in need, easing their struggle for survival and helping them cope with the most severe economic crisis of the country's history.

NUTRITIONAL SECURITY INITIATIVE

Reducing nutritional insecurity among families and individuals living in poverty by rescuing, collecting and distributing food, whilst empowering local associations and raising awareness of the issue of food shortage issue in Israel.

During 2020, we increased our support to local NGOs in response to the economic crisis and distributed \$47M (NIS 155M) worth of food to more than 200 associations and social services throughout the country.

"TOGETHER FOR YOU" – A JOINT PROJECT WITH THE FOOD INDUSTRIES ASSOCIATION OF ISRAEL

During the "first wave" of the crisis, a unique collaboration was launched with the Food Industries Association of the Manufacturers' Association of Israel, in which 43 Israeli food companies came together to donate tens of thousands of food products to the elderly people throughout the country. The exciting collaboration proved that there is room for both competition and tremendous unity during the crisis.





"LATET-GIVE AND INSPIRE" CONFERENCE

Despite this unusual year, we did not give up the annual conference for our local partner NGOs that took place in an interactive manner. The conference was attended by 130 directors of Latet's partner NGOs.

The conference was attended by the Minister of Welfare and Social Services, MK Itzik Shmuli, and two fascinating and inspiring lectures were given by the Mayor of Yeruham, Tal Ohana, and the photographer Ziv Koren, who documented the events of the past year through the lens of his camera, providing a unique and deep perspective of the crisis.

FOOD RESCUE

A unique project for rescuing food products that are intended to be thrown away despite still being edible and distributing them to families in need.

With the COVID-19 crisis, financial hardship and growing need for food aid, the field of food rescue has gained a significant place in the public debate. It is increasingly being understood that no stone must be left unturned if edible food is to be saved from being thrown away and given to the multitude of families that suffer from severe nutritional food insecurity.

This year's mobilization of the Israeli food industry, manufacturers, importers, and retail chains has led to a significant leap in the amount of food rescued.

FOOD RESCUE IN RETAIL CHAINS

According to many studies, stores and supermarket chains are one of the main sources of food waste.

Latet's breakthrough food rescue project with Shufersal (the leading supermarket chain in Israel) is a cornerstone in food rescue in retail chains.

The project currently takes place in **78** Shufersal supermarkets and rescues more than \$1.5M (NIS 5M) worth of food a year. Recently, Latet expanded the project and started rescuing food from the "Osher Ad" chain.

We are grateful to Shufersal and Osher Ad, and we hope that the initiative will serve as an example for additional retail chains to engage in this necessary field.

AID FOR LIFE

The program aims to improve the quality of life of Holocaust survivors in need and to provide them with immediate relief. By demonstrating care, mutual responsibility and concern for their situation, the program provides physical and social assistance that enables them to live a life with dignity.

Impoverished Holocaust survivors found themselves in double the struggle during this time. Alongside the health dangers, serious psychological consequences arose because of the social isolation and their many concerns about their ability to cope with the lack of basic needs and poverty during this difficult period.

Along with the increased material assistance (food and hygiene), together with the program's volunteers we tried to strengthen the relationship with the survivors. As the volunteers were prevented from meeting the survivors physically due to the situation, we did so in ways available to us in order to decrease the impact of their loneliness and to spot additional needs we could respond to thanks to our Emergency Fund for Holocaust survivors.

LATET YOUTH

A youth organization that aims to educate young citizens on the values of volunteering, social solidarity and mutual responsibility alongside leadership development and encouraging social entrepreneurship.

Following the COVID-19 crisis, we moved our activities online and became an anchor for the teens during this period of uncertainty. The members went out and initiated various volunteering initiatives in response to the needs created by the pandemic, such as packing food boxes and participating in a campaign to raise awareness to the importance of wearing a mask.

OPERATION "LONELINESS RELIEF FOR THE ELDERLY"

During the crisis, Latet Youth's members volunteered from home and called the elderly in order to help them feel less lonely and to see if they could be helped during this challenging period. Shani Fogel, a member who participated in the operation, says: "I spoke to a Holocaust survivor today. We live in the same area and I wanted to know if she needed any help... Her husband died and it is difficult for her to be alone so I promised her that I would keep in touch with her and help her with everything she needed in the lockdown. I really love her and I hope we will be good friends. "





OPERATION "LATET-GIVE A COMPUTER"

When the Latet Youth's members in Netanya realized that remote learning would not end anytime soon, they decided to launch an operation during which they collected old computers and distributed them to the children who needed them. As part of the operation, **50** computers were distributed.



AWARENESS AND ADVOCACY

A variety of activities to raise awareness about poverty and to lead change in national priorities.

Our main goal this year was to demand that the government allocate funds to promote nutritional security as part of the state budget. Due to political instability and the lack of a budget approval, we have worked to increase the low government funding previously allocated to addressing nutritional insecurity - a problem that has expanded to unprecedented proportions in the wake of the economic crisis. As part of these efforts, support for the distribution of food packages and umbrella organizations has been tripled to \$5.5M (NIS 18M).

This is the 18th year we have published the Alternative Poverty Report. The report includes a unique study addressing the effect of the COVID-19 crisis on economic hardship and poverty in Israel, an up-to-date picture of the nutritional insecurity issue, and a unique look at the impact of the coronavirus and the economic crisis on impoverished citizens receiving assistance from Latet's partner NGOs.

The report was presented to the President of Israel and received extensive media exposure with the objective to place the problem of poverty and nutritional insecurity on the public agenda and to put forward solutions.

During the year, the scope of volunteering at Latet has increased significantly. The COVID-19 crisis has raised the number of requests for volunteering. It warms our heart to know that thousands of volunteers showed up to help and take part in the emergency operation for the victims of the crisis. Despite the uncertainty and social distance imposed on us, thousands of volunteers chose to give their time. Thanks to these volunteers, we were able to provide extensive assistance to isolated seniors and families in need.

UNIQUE EVENTS AND PARTNERSHIPS

JOINT EMERGENCY FUND

As part of Latet's emergency operations during the COVID-19 crisis, we created the Joint Emergency Fund whose operations are defined by three main components: large-scale assistance, responsiveness and response to basic needs.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR THE ELDERLY IN NEED

A project in collaboration with the IFCJ and dozens of other partners from the philanthropic and business sectors. During the first three months of the crisis, we helped 15,000 isolated and impoverished elderly people and delivered emergency boxes consisting of food and hygiene products directly to their doorstep. The purpose of this operation was to ensure that the most fragile and unfortunate seniors citizens can stay safe at home and reduce their exposure to the virus while having their basic needs met.

WINTER PROJECT

As part of the project, joined by the Arison Foundation, the Adelis Foundation and Osem-Nestlé, essential winter equipment was distributed to more than 10,000 families and elderly people in need: blankets, radiators, and more.

DOING GOOD TOGETHER

As part of this large-scale joint project with Strauss Group, thousands of families hit by the economic crisis (the "new poor") received monthly vouchers worth \$235 (NIS 800) per family for 4 months to purchase products from Strauss Group in the retail stores. A big thank you to Strauss Group for this ground-breaking collaboration.

FIRST INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE

As part of our efforts to raise awareness of Latet's work among the International community, we organized our very first virtual conference:

"From Chaos to Relief - Civil Society's Response to COVID-19: A US-Israel Dialogue"

The conference was attended by more than 1,000 people, including directors of American philanthropic foundations and federations, along with heads of associations in Israel and the United States.

The conference discussed how the pandemic affects the field of volunteering and how the American and Israeli public respond to the challenges posed by the COVID-19 and the economic crisis.

The annual prime-time telethon was held on Channel 12 before Rosh Hashanah.

The telethon was produced in partnership with the TV program "Music School" with the participation of celebrities from the program, the best singers of the year and the hosts Lior Suchard and Shani Cohen. During the evening, 220,317 holiday meals were donated to the elderly and families in need - the highest amount of donations to date.
